Chair Kris Coons called the meeting to order at 9:00 am.

## Invocation

The Invocation was delivered by the Republican Party of Bexar County Chaplain Anita Kegley with special prayers for Alma Jackson who is very ill and for SREC SD25 Committeeman Mike Wheeler who is recovering from back surgery.

## The Star-Spangled Banner

The national anthem was sung by Elizabeth McAlester, the Choir Director of Christian School of Castle Hills.

## Pledge of Allegiance

SREC SD 21 Committeeman Randy Pulham led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance to the US and Texas flags.

## Determination of Quorum

Republican Party of Texas (RPT) Rule 9 states at least one fourth of the membership shall constitute a quorum. There are currently 249 precinct chairmen so 62 members

are required for a quorum. It is confirmed 95 members are in attendance, so a quorum is present.

## Chairman's Remarks

Chair Coons stated it is 50 days until the May elections, and we are able to change the political leadership in San Antonio. There is at least one Republican candidate in every race. There is information in the packets providing election locations and the schedule (Attachment A) and a sample ballot for San Antonio (Attachment B). She discussed the need to maintain the momentum from the November elections and increase turnout of conservative voters in this traditionally low turnout election. She then

Increase turnout of conservative voters in this traditionally low turnout election. She then discussed several plans under consideration to support Republicans in the run-off. She has spoken to nearly every candidate and the Party will not promote any candidate that has not met with her. She urged "Vote for Common sense and conservative candidates in the COSA elections!"

## Approval of Minutes

Secretary Diane Rath stated the draft minutes for the December 14, 2024, CEC meeting were distributed electronically with the call for this meeting. Editorial changes were requested, and a revised draft was posted on the website and is now submitted for approval. MJ Smoot, Pct. 3075, moved approval as revised and a second by Teresa Bollin, Pct. 1082. The revised minutes were approved without dissent.

## Finance Report (Attachment B)

Paula Villagran, Pct. 3203, presented the Finance Report for Treasurer Lille Gough. Revenue YTD \$280,712.54 and Expenses YTD \$183,655.47. Revenue less Expenses YTD \$97,057.07 vs. Budget \$36,632. Cash Balance of \$101,190.82. There are 107 sustaining members who have contributed \$31,517 YTD.

Jennifer Hendrix, Pct. 3145, moved all the individuals, both present and not present, to be ratified. The motion was seconded by Paul James, Pct 3190. The motion was approved without dissent. Chair Kris Coons then administered the oath of office to those present.

After the election of the new precinct chairmen, the quorum present were 105.

## Election of Contested Precinct Chairmen

There are no contested precinct chairmen.

## Resolutions Committee Report

Steve Jordan, Pct. 3105, Chairman of Rules and Resolutions Committee, presented the Committee reports. The Rules Committee met immediately before the Resolutions Committee but had no business to conduct so adjourned.

The Resolutions Committee met twice and is bringing forth three resolutions for consideration.

## CASINOS - (Attachment D)

The proposed resolution, "urges the state legislature to keep the prohibition against sports betting and casino gambling in our state Constitution and oppose attempts to place this issue on the ballot." After debate with three speakers For and Against the resolution, the resolution was adopted with a vote of 72 in favor of the motion.

## PROJECT MARVEL- (Attachment E)

The proposed resolution "objects to any attempt to relocate the San Antonio Spurs to a new arena developed or renovated by public funds ... and objects to the wasting of public funds to expand the city's sports and entertainment industry". The resolution was adopted without debate.

## RESOLUTION TO VACATE ABANDONED PRECINCTS (Attachment F)

This resolution differs from those adopted in previous terms as it is more limited and not continuing. This is a one-time permission naming the impacted precinct chairs. "pursuant to TEC 171.029(b), the County Executive Committee of the Republican Party of Bexar County authorizes the county chair to send notice to each aforementioned precinct chair(s) in accordance with said section; and ...pursuant to TEC 171.029(d), the office of any aforementioned precinct chair who, within seven days of receiving said notice, fails to respond to the chair's notice and affirmatively state they wish to remain in office, shall be deemed vacant, and said vacancy may be filled..." Marian Stanko, Pct. 3015, moved to amend the resolution by removing the names of Elginio Rodriguez (2074) and Brad Kessler (4043) since they are present today. Several people seconded the motion. The amendment was unanimously approved.

After debate and three speakers For and Against, the amended motion was adopted. The precinct chairs named in the adopted resolution are Lupe Rivera (1014). Michael Martinez (1057), Carlos Martinez (1058), Jason West (1128), Warren Kitchen (1155), Ramon Rodriguez (2020), Maria Campa (2027), Anne Englert (2062), Russell Pierce (2084), Joe Garza (2148), Gregory Canty (2166), Craig Schlebel (3006), Jeffrey McManus (3022), Edward Nino (3028), Leigha Almendarez (3087), Librado Salinas (3093), Pamela Millisor (3096), Zander Guckian (3117), Maria Zarb-Cousin (3173), Cameron McFly (4028), Arthur Brown (4073), Gloria Melendez (4085), Sheryl Meade (4189).

## **New Business**

Robert Gonzales, Pct. 2040, moved to remove Trinity Haddox from the Bexar GOP website as a Republican candidate in City of San Antonio D7 election. Mr. Gonzales feels Mr. Haddox has made comments inconsistent with a Republican (Attachment G). Chair Coons stated the criteria for being included on our website and stated Mr. Haddox has signed an oath of allegiance. The RPT rules state you are qualified as a Republican if you vote in the Republican primary or sign the oath of allegiance. Chair Coons stated

this should be a resolution submitted to the Resolution Committee before the meeting and the motion is therefore out of order.

## Announcements

Karen Marshall, SREC 26, presented a report from SREC. She urged people to sign up to be voter registrars as we need many more. The SREC is meeting March 21 and 22 in Austin and she invited everyone to attend. She also livestreams the meetings for increased access. She serves on the Voter Integrity Committee and provided an update on relevant legislation.

Mike Wheeler, SREC 25, informed the group of a symposium in Austin on Wednesday, March 19, on "Securing the Grid". After the symposium the group will go to the Capitol to lobby members on the Issue.

Randy Pulham, SREC 21, stated on Thursday, March 20, there will be a Texas GOP Legislative Priorities Day at the Capitol (Attachment H). He also informed us the SREC has created a Military Partnership Committee.

Tracy Ebersole, Pct 2111, stated he is a candidate for Balcones Heights City Council position #4. His campaign theme is "Time for a Change".

Virginia Castaneda, Pct. 1051, informed the group she and others attended the CD 20 Town Hall hosted by Congressman Castro. She stated the Republicans were harassed and denied the opportunity to speak. She urged all Republicans to attend any future meetings.

Paul James, Pct.3190, is President of the Young Republicans of Bexar County and its meeting will be held Monday, March 24, 6:30-8:30 at Magic Time Machine. They also have a website now, BexarYR.com.

Carl Merkel, Pct.4096, reiterated the importance of the upcoming San Antonio city elections as there is a real chance to flip the elected leadership.

Frank Fonseca, Pct.2060, urged support for Tracy Ebersole's election.

Teresa Bollin, Pct 1082, asked people to consider volunteering at headquarters to support the candidates in upcoming elections.

Allen Hamilton, Pct 3102, stated he is developing a new website AlamoScorecard.com that will rate the COSA candidates based on their record (Attachment I). He urged the increase of the conservative voter tumout in May to influence the election. His group continues to be named Network for Patriots.

Elginio Rodriguez, Pct.2074, stated his opposition to the construction of new roads where asbestos is left flowing through the water pipes and urged people to become informed.

Geri Peters, Pct 3063, said electing a conservative in D1 is vital and urged attendance at the D1 Candidate Forum Thursday March 20 at 6:30 at Vogt Auction.

Kyle Bolch, Pct 3125, said PASA focuses on block walking and is meeting today at Bill Miller's on 281 to walk for Misty Spears. The group has postcards in case a volunteer cannot walk but could address postcards.

Rhett Smith, Pct 2149, expressed the importance of having just two Republican Candidates in each race. He is concerned that the large number of candidates in a race will ensure the Republicans will not make the run-off. So please review the candidates carefully.

Dylan Young, Pct. 3088, informed the group of the website Freedomindex.com.

Linda Sefton, Pct. 4058, stated the smaller municipalities are being targeted by the Legislature this year. She discussed SB 673 which limits a city's ability to regulate ancillary buildings in a residential area.

Kyle Sinclair, Pct.1143 and Vice-Chairman, thanked Chair Coons for her leadership this year. He also stated he testified on SB511 by Bettencourt which would prohibit publicly paid voter registration efforts by third parties. He also urged us to take advantage of any media opportunity to present the conservative position on issues.


Chair Coons stated we need to support the new Elections Administrator Michele Carew since the position is so important, but we need to also be informed of all actions taken by the new Administrator.






